## JANUARY SUMMARY REPORTS - Live January 27 @ 4:00 p.m.

It is important that teachers, parents, and students are partners in education. Teachers share assessment information to communicate student progress. Assessment is the process of gathering information about what a student knows, understands, and can do in relation to learning outcomes established by Alberta Education.

All schools in ECSD provide ongoing assessment as a variety of classroom assessments guide teachers with what they need to do next. Formal reporting to parents occurs at the Demonstration of Learning in later Fall and in the Spring. In addition, through PowerTeacherPro, there is a formal snapshot of learning in January with the Summary Report, and an end of year Report Card in June. In between these events, teachers may send work and projects home, send messages in agendas, coach students with how to talk about their learning, connect with parents, and review the IPP (if applicable). Each school leverages a variety of ways to share student achievement, and some of these strategies may vary from one school to another as there are many ways to share the ongoing learning throughout the year. As always, if you are concerned regarding your child's progress, it is important that you connect with your child's teacher as soon as you are able.



## ***REGISTRATIONS FOR 2026-2027 - Opens February 2, 2026***

**New Students:** On **Monday, February 2, 2026 at 9:00 a.m.**, families new to Edmonton Catholic Schools can register for the 2026-2027 school year for **Pre-k through to returning grade 12's**. In order to register, they will need to know what school they are hoping to attend (<https://www.ecsd.net/step-1-find-your-school>) and create a School Engage account and complete their on-line registration (<https://www.ecsd.net/register>). Children eligible to register for Kindergarten must turn 5 on or before December 31 of the year they start Kindergarten. Please refer friends, families or neighbors to [stmary.ecsd.net](http://stmary.ecsd.net) to register.

The application deadline for School Start-Up in September is usually the end of May. (Please watch for the deadline date in upcoming newsletters). If your child currently accesses yellow bussing, they will be automatically rolled over for bussing for first day of school in September and a new application is not needed. ## **BUSSING CHANGES for 2026-2027**

### **Yellow Bus Eligibility Changes effective September 2025 - PLEASE REVIEW - from Transportation**

In March 2023, the Alberta Education Minister announced a change in eligibility for bussing to be implemented in September 2023.

Students that are eligible for yellow bus service will be determined by where a student lives (or from the address that families are requesting bussing from).

**Eligibility Update:** Please be advised that the Government of Alberta has revised the eligibility criteria for yellow bus service for elementary students. Effective September 1, 2025, the distance criteria for Grades 1 to 6 students will be 1.6 kilometres instead of 1 kilometre from their designated school. The criteria for Grades 7 to 12 students will remain unchanged at 2 kilometres.

In fairness to families, allowing parents time to make alternate arrangements, the Division made the decision to **postpone the removal of service until September 2025**. Transportation Services has been accommodating families that are now eligible for bussing under the new regulation, the removal of service began for school start-up, September 2025. **Currently adding the notes on stop descriptions is an additional way of advising families of the changes coming.**

**The Division will not be making exceptions for stops to remain in place as adequate notice has been served to schools and families.**

## **PRE-ENOLMENT (Returning) STUDENTS for 2026-2027**

**Current ECSD Students:** As of **February 2, 2026**, pre-enrolment for returning students is **OPEN** in the [PowerSchool Parent Portal](#). Please click on School Engage, "Pre-Enrolment for the Next Year" and follow the prompts to indicate your child's registrations intentions for the 2026-2027 school year. Pre-enrolment is key to helping us understand how many students to expect in September 2026 and helps us plan for staffing, class sizes and programming. Families are needed to share their plans for next September regardless of if they are staying with their current school or transitioning into kindergarten, junior high, or high school. To learn more, visit [ecsd.net/pre-enrolment](http://ecsd.net/pre-enrolment). **This pre-enrolment process will remain open until March 14, 2025. Detailed instructions are also on the next 2 pages.**

The instructions refer to the 2024-2025 school year however are the same for this school year.



The purpose of Pre-enrolment is to give families the opportunity to let us know what their registration plans are for the next school term.

All students currently in our Division need to complete the pre-enrolment form, regardless of whether they are remaining at their current school or transitioning to another ECSD school. This process needs to be completed for each child in the family.

**Pre-enrolment submissions can be made through the PowerSchool Parent Portal from February 3 – March 14, 2025.**





### **STAY HOME WHEN SICK**



*As students and staff return for another exciting school year the health, safety and well-being of all students and staff remains a top priority.*

*Parents are asked to please continue to monitor your child for symptoms daily before coming to school. This is one of the most effective ways to prevent the spread of illness. Anyone who is exhibiting symptoms of illness, including fever, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, new or worsening cough, or shortness of breath, should remain at home until their symptoms have improved and they have been free of fever for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication, and they feel well enough to resume normal activities. If your child becomes sick at school, parents/guardians will be called to pick them up. If your child is away from school for any reason, please call the school office to let us know.*

*At our school we are,*

- Encouraging students to wash and/or sanitize their hands regularly. Hand sanitizer is available at our school.*
- Prioritizing frequent cleaning and disinfection of high-touch surfaces.*
- Ensuring proper ventilation is extremely important to us. We have installed the ASHRAE-recommended MERV 13 filters in our school, and our HVAC systems are running for extended periods of time. We continue to reference and implement ASHRAE guidance where practicable within the limitations of existing infrastructure across the Division.*
- Respecting individual choice regarding masks. Our priority is supporting a welcoming, caring, respectful, and safe learning environment.*
- Reporting illness to Alberta Health Services when school-wide student absentee rates are over 10% due to illness so they can investigate and advise. This has always been our division practice.*

## **LEARNING WHILE ON VACATION**

St. Mary School recognizes that a child's educational experience is not confined to the school building and that vacation trips can be enlightening and valuable to a child's intellectual growth. Please keep in mind that the learning and teaching that is missed cannot easily be replicated outside the classroom or in a worksheet and your child may miss parts of the curriculum. Teachers structure their classes for both instruction and assessment according to the regulations established by the provincial government. Teachers are not required to provide assignments for vacations but could share topics being covered so you include them in your daily discussions. Google classrooms may allow for completion of assignments but opportunities for interaction and questions will be impacted as well as feedback for assessment. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call the school.

## **LUNCHES**

## **LUNCH drop offs**

We encourage children to bring their lunch with them as they arrive to school in the morning as to limit disruption to learning and work flow. **Noon drop offs of fast food items are discouraged.** All essentials for eating their lunch should be packed as the school does not provide disposable supplies - cutlery etc. for student use. Healthy lunches are encouraged together with reducing disposable waste.

### **Lunches and Allergy Reminders**

Students in our school have severe life-threatening allergy to peanuts and tree nuts. Exposure to even a minute amount of the food substance could cause anaphylactic shock. Even a small trace of peanut butter on a friend's hand could be transferred to the student and can cause emergency treatment that involves an immediate epi-pen injection and an emergency trip to the hospital.

Given the situation, we are requesting that parents refrain from including "peanuts and peanut products" in lunches or snacks. Since this allergy is so very severe, we ask that if a child eats a peanut product in the morning prior to coming to school, to have the child wash their hands and face with soap and water.

While this request may pose an inconvenience for you when packing your child's lunch and snack, we thank you for your support and understanding as we endeavor to facilitate a safe learning environment for all students. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the school to discuss further.

## BUSSING 2026-2027



All NEW applications, changes to bussing addresses, cancellations or replacement bus pass requests **must** be completed online through the following link- <https://ecsd.mybusplanner.ca/>

Parents are asked to monitor their Powerschool Parent portal weekly to obtain their child's route information and check for any changes to the schedule. Bus pass fees for 2026-27 are all \$50.00 for both Yellow bus and ETS, with no additional family plan discount.

**Kindergarten & Grade 1 Students:** Parents or guardians are to be present at the scheduled time and drop-off location for all Kindergarten and Grade 1 students. *Please note that neighbours or family friends are not considered guardians. If a parent/guardian cannot be at the bus stop for drop-off, only a sibling in grade 6 or higher is permitted to take their younger siblings off the bus.*

### Daily bus delays - What to do when your yellow school bus is running late?

We want all families prepared in the event of bus delays. While bus drivers will complete their route, no matter how late they may be running, we recommend that families make alternate arrangements if a bus does not arrive within **20 minutes** of its scheduled time.

To help prepare for a delayed bus, families are reminded to:

- Check for delays before you head out the door via the BusPlanner Delays App or the [ECSD bus delays website](#).
- We recommend children wait with a friend or trusted adult at the bus stop.
- Have a plan in case the bus does not arrive. For example, return home or go to a neighbour's house.
- Make alternate arrangements for getting their child to school if needed.
- Dress children appropriately for the weather to withstand any delays or wait times .
