CLASS CONFIGURATIONS for 2026-2027

St. Mary will have combined grades next year at some levels. Since this is very common, Edmonton Catholic School Division has developed excellent resources for teachers of combined grades. Here is some information that you should be aware of as it is likely that throughout your child's school years they will be placed in a combined environment at some point.

Research has shown that a combined grade classroom, where students from multiple grade levels learn together, can offer several benefits:

1. Individualized Learning: Students in a combined grade classroom often receive more personalized attention and instruction tailored to their specific needs. Teachers can address the unique learning styles, abilities, and pace of each student, fostering a more inclusive and supportive learning environment.

2. Peer Tutoring: Older students can serve as mentors and role models for younger students, helping them grasp concepts and develop skills. This peer tutoring dynamic promotes collaboration, empathy, and the development of leadership qualities among the older students.

3. Enhanced Social Skills: Being in a mixed-grade classroom encourages interaction and cooperation among students of different ages. This setting promotes socialization, empathy, and the development of strong communication and teamwork skills.

4. Flexible Grouping: Combined grade classrooms allow for flexible grouping strategies, enabling students to work in small groups or individually based on their abilities and interests. This approach supports differentiation and encourages students to take ownership of their learning.

5. Continuous Progression: Students in combined grade classrooms often benefit from continuity in their education. They have the opportunity to build on previous knowledge and skills over multiple years, which can contribute to a more thorough understanding of concepts and better long-term retention.

As in single-grade classrooms, teachers use a variety of strategies to ensure that the appropriate grade curriculum expectations are covered. As in every classroom, single-grade or combined, teachers are supporting learners at varying levels. For example, if you take any subject, you may have some students who are working at grade level, others who are working towards grade level, and some who are working above grade level.

Combined classrooms look like any other classroom. You'll see flexible seating, work stations and activity centers. There are conference areas, reading spaces and group gathering areas. Teachers create engaging learning spaces that work best for the students. In terms of everyday lessons, as in any classroom, the teacher may have the whole class participate in a common activity, and then begin working individually or in a small group on grade-specific curriculum expectations. Teachers of both single and combined grades assess the skills, abilities, knowledge, and interests of their students. Using differentiated instruction, teachers design whole and small group activities to address varying student strengths, needs, and interests. Teachers work to meet each student where they are on their learning journey and help move them along in the way they learn best, regardless of their grade level.

Many teachers have observed that older students in a combined class often make good decisions knowing they are role models for younger students – and as a result, the older students naturally develop leadership skills. Some teachers often find that the younger students tend to develop greater confidence simply by working with older students on a regular basis. All of this builds a strong sense of community.

CLASS LISTS FOR 2026-2027

Throughout the school year, St. Mary teachers have been creating class profiles that highlight students' strengths and needs. When creating class lists for 2026-2027, teachers will use this information to create balanced class groupings that will meet the needs of all learners.

The following criteria will be used to create class lists:

- Academic strengths and needs
- Work habits
- Social/Emotional Needs
- Gender
- Peer relationships

To honor this process, we will not be accepting parental requests or student choice of friends to create our class lists. We strongly feel that the criteria listed above and the highlighting of student strengths and needs through this school year will be instrumental in guiding teachers and administration in making the best possible class groupings.

Thank you in advance for supporting this professional and educational approach to creating class lists.

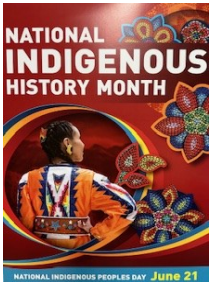

BUG SPRAY and SUNSCREEN

As the spring weather warms, children will spend more time outdoors while at school. Alberta Health Services has provided the following recommendations regarding the use of bug spray and sunscreen. The following guidelines will be followed by staff:

BUG SPRAY

- It is recommended parents do not apply bug spray prior to children leaving for school as prolonged exposure to bug spray is not recommended for elementary-age children.
- It is suggested that parents send long pants and long-sleeved jackets with their child as it is much better for students to cover up when they are outside, rather than using bug spray. The peak eating times for mosquitoes are dawn and dusk and these times are not during school hours, so by covering up, children should be okay outside.

In keeping with the AHS recommendations,

- Staff members will not be spraying insect repellent on students.
- Should parents send insect repellent with their children, for safety precautions, this insect repellent is not to be shared with other students. Depending on the age of the child, teachers may store the insect repellent in a safe spot in the classroom.
- Insect repellent should also only be sprayed outside, away from other students.

SUNSCREEN, AHS recommendations are the same.

Staff will refrain from applying both repellent and sunscreen to students.

REGISTRATIONS FOR 2026-2027 - Still Being Accepted

New Students:

- Children eligible to register for Kindergarten must **turn 5 on or before December 31** of the year they start Kindergarten.

NEW PROGRAM at St. Mary for 2026-2027

Beginning next school year, St. Mary School will be proud to host a **GIST Classroom (Guided Intervention Supported Transition)** as part of Edmonton Catholic Schools' continuum of inclusive supports.

The GIST program is designed to provide short-term, skills-based support for a small group of students with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) who benefit from targeted intervention to strengthen learning and self-regulation skills. The goal of the program is to help students build the skills they need to be successful in their learning environments and, when ready, transition back to their home community schools.

At St. Mary, the GIST classroom will serve up to eight students and will be staffed by a highly trained team, including a classroom teacher, an Emotional Behavioural Specialist, and a Therapeutic Assistant for each student attending from their community school. Students are also supported by a multi-disciplinary team, ensuring programming is intentional, well-supported, and responsive.

The GIST program is carefully planned and structured to support both the students in the program and the wider school community. Transitions into and out of the program are gradual and guided, with a strong focus on student success, safety, and belonging.

We look forward to welcoming this program to St. Mary and continuing our shared commitment to inclusive, compassionate, and well-supported learning environments for all students.

GRADE 4-6 CHROMEBOOKS for 2026-2027

All students in grades 4-6 will need to bring a Chromebook or laptop as part of their school supplies. These devices will be used daily to access Google Classroom and other online resources both at school and home.

We will not have backup devices available, so if a student forgets their device, they will need to complete their work on paper or at home.

Transportation Applications: The **2026-2027** Transportation Application is available through

<https://ecsd.mybusplanner.ca/>

- All **NEW** applications, **changes** to bussing addresses, and cancellations **must** be completed online through the following link- <https://www.ecsd.net/apply-for-transportation> by **June 1, 2026** to ensure bus service is ready for the first day of school.
- If your child currently accesses yellow bussing, they will be automatically rolled over for bussing for first day of school in September and a new application is not needed. If you have any questions about transportation for the upcoming school year, Please contact Transportation Services at transportationservice@ecsd.net or call 780-441-6078.
- The Government of Alberta revised the eligibility criteria for yellow bus service for Elementary Students effective September 1, 2025 to 1.6 kilometers from their designated school. The Grade 7 to 12 students remain unchanged at 2 kilometers.

Boundaries can vary year by year. Please ensure you select the correct school year when checking eligibility.

- **Parents are asked to monitor their Powerschool Parent portal weekly to obtain their child’s route information and check for any changes to the schedule.**
- [There has been an increase in Bus pass fees for 2026 - 2027. The attached letter has been sent home to parents. Yellow bus fees for students Kindergarten to Grade 12 will be \\$70.00 per month per child. ETS bus fees will remain at \\$60.00 per month. There are no additional family plan discounts.](#)
- **Kindergarten & Grade 1 Students:** Parents or guardians are to be present at the scheduled time and drop-off location for all Kindergarten and Grade 1 students. *Please note that neighbours or family friends are not considered guardians. If a parent/guardian cannot be at the bus stop for drop-off, only a sibling in **grade 6 or higher** is permitted to take their younger siblings off the bus.*

Dear ECS D Families,

We are writing to inform you about changes to student transportation fees for the upcoming 2026-2027 school year.

As with many school divisions across Alberta, Edmonton Catholic Schools continues to experience rising transportation costs due to increased student demand, changes to provincial funding, and higher carrier rates. While provincial funding supports the majority of costs, it does not cover all expenses. To help reduce the impact on classroom funding and maintain safe and reliable service, we must adjust our transportation fees.

Transportation Fees for 2026-2027 School Year

The updated student transportation fees for the 2026-2027 school year:

- Yellow Bus (Kindergarten to Grade 12): \$70 per month
- Edmonton Transit Service (ETS): \$60 per month
- Replacement Bus Passes: \$6 for ETS Arc cards
- Specialized Yellow Bus Service: No cost (for students who require additional care or support)

These changes ensure consistency across grade levels and support the continued delivery of efficient and equitable transportation services. Students who require specialized transportation will continue to access service at no cost for the 2026-2027 school year. We understand that any increase in fees can be challenging. If your family requires assistance, please speak with your child's school.

For those students joining us new to St. Mary in Grade 1-6, or who missed the Kindergarten Orientation, you are invited to have a tour of the school with the Principal on August 31 at 3:00 PM. Please ring the bell at the front entrance and meet in the foyer of the school.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES through SCHOOL START - 2026-2027

This year St. Mary will provide parents the option of pre-ordering supplies on-line through School Start at <https://schoolstart.ca/>. Lists will be available on line by the end of June 2026.

Teachers from each grade level team collaborate to create the school supply list needed for the students in their grade. Parents will have the option of purchasing the items on their own or preordering online through **SCHOOL START** and having the supplies delivered to their home.

There are however, items that your child will need that cannot be purchased in a store or have been pre-ordered by the school (agenda books, visual journals, recorders and optional yearbooks). The cost of these extra supplies become part of school fees and is added to your child's account in Powerschool.

Grade 4-6 students are required to provide their own chromebooks. The chromebooks can be purchased elsewhere as they are not available through School Start.

Detailed supply lists and the link for ordering supplies through **SCHOOL START** will be available on the school website. If you are interested in ordering school supplies through this method, **please place your order on-line, as will be detailed on the order form online.** Pre-purchased supplies will be packaged by SCHOOL START and delivered to your home. Please note that the supply list indicates the required supplies for all students whether you decide to purchase through SCHOOL START or purchase these items on your own. Also, even if your child is in a combined grade, you would still order/purchase the supplies for their grade.

Plan Ahead for the 2026-2027 School Year - 2026-2027 CALENDAR - Updated

Families can now view, download, and print the updated 2026–2027 school year calendar. Please note, the division updated the next school year calendar in April 2026. While the total number of instructional and operational days remains the same, a few dates have changed. **The first day of school is now Wednesday, September 2, 2026.** October 19 has been designated by the Alberta Government as a NO CLASS day as it is the Referendum Day. The Remembrance Day Weekend/Fall Break has been extended and will run from November 11 to November 13, 2026. Students will return to classes on Monday, November 16, 2026.
